CONFIRMATION: In order to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, young people must have regularly participated in Catholic religious education from First Eucharist until they are a Junior in High School. Classes are held the last Sunday of each month.

RCIA: Adult religious education classes - every Wednesday at 7 p.m. from September through Pentecost.




The next S.A.L.T. gathering is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, October 9, 2024 in the Fr. Richard Administration Building.
